Subject: Non-career NALC CCA and Distributing Mail

The language referenced in the non-career CCA position is the same language that is in the career letter carrier position now and has been there for many years.

The letter carriers position description state they may perform tertiary distribution. This is the same language that has always existed for regular letter carriers that pre-dated the numerous national arbitration decisions placing **distribution of mail** in the clerk craft.

In addition, the PSE MOU clearly states on page 279 that PSEs are the ONLY non-career employees who may work within our bargaining unit.

If we initiate a dispute at this level all grievances on this would be held in abeyance.

<u>Please send me an e-mail so that I can attempt to intervene at this level if this becomes an issue</u>. File a local grievance also to protect any timelines.

In a regional arbitration we would take the position this is a violation of Article 7.2 and the PSE MOU.

Unless we get evidence the USPS is taking the position at the HQ level these CCAs may perform clerk work, there is no upside to filing a national dispute.

Distribution of mail is clerk work and there are national arbitrations to support this position.
